Harbour fees

<u>Per gross registered tonnage (GRT)</u>	
Per vessel entry	\$0.0285/GRT
Fishing boats	No fees

Harbour fees are claimable monthly for each of the five first entries of a vessel in a port.

Berthage fees

All vessels, except fishing boats	
<u>Per gross registered tonnage (GRT)</u>	
For each 12-hour period, whether full or not	\$0.015/GRT
Minimum berthage fee	\$50
Fishing boats	
<u>Per metre in length per day (m/day)</u>	\$0.45/m/day
Minimum fee per day	\$21

Electricity, water, garbage collection, wastewater disposal, snow clearing and dock cleaning	Cost price + 25%

Security costs are assumed by the stevedoring company.

The port authority will charge security fees to the charterer if a vessel must dock to shelter or perform emergency work.
